Your Data, Your Privacy:

When you use an AI tool, it's crucial to understand the relationship between your input and the model's training.

- **What is 'Training Data'?:** AI models are like students who learn from a massive library of information to understand patterns and relationships. This "library" is called the training data, and for most public AI, this data comes from the vast, publicly available information on the internet.
- **Your Data, Your Control:** When you input information into a public AI tool, it becomes part of the data that the model uses to learn and improve. It's safest to assume that anything you type in could be used for this purpose. This means you should never share confidential, sensitive, or personally identifiable information with a public AI model.
